

Policy for Selecting Partners and Accepting Contributions and Donations

Engineers Without Borders Sweden (EWB-SWE) partners with companies and organizations in agreements that mutually benefit both parties and the communities we engage in. A partnership with EWB-SWE is a long-term collaboration, contributing to daily operations through a close, collaborative relationship. It allows the development and implementation of our activities, to extend our scope, and to realize our mission. When partnering with a global enterprise, EWB-SWE partners with the local, legal entity. The partner's products or services must be in line with EWB-SWE's values and mission.

The UN Sustainable Development Goals are an essential basis for EWB-SWE's operations. Therefore, potential partners must have an active commitment to sustainability within their core business. This commitment may manifest itself through, for example, a commitment to the UN Sustainable Development Goals and regular, comprehensive sustainability reporting. Where possible, partners are encouraged to work in a broader sustainability context such as sustainable supply chains, human rights, biodiversity, fair working conditions. The promotion of equality and diversity based on ethnicity, religion, age, disability, sexual orientation, and gender expression is also a core principle of EWB-SWE and partners should similarly be committed to these principles, in particular at the management level.

EWB-SWE does not accept support, donations, or contributions from companies or organizations whose primary or secondary revenue source comes from:

- Alcohol
- Tobacco
- Illegal narcotics
- Pornography
- Weapons
- Political parties or lobbying

EWB-SWE reserves the right to refuse support, donations, or contributions from companies or organizations whose primary or secondary revenue source comes from:

- The extraction of fossil fuels
- Deforestation
- Gambling

EWB-SWE reserves the right to refuse support, donations, or contributions from companies or organizations that have been convicted of any of the following during the last five years:

- Violation of human rights
- Corruption
- Environmental crime
- Animal abuse
